European Directorate of 19 November 2008

Obligation on EU Member States to promote the collection and treatment of biowaste.

Circular of the Ministry of Ecology of 10 January 2012

Obligation source sorting of biowaste for their value to the people who produce them or who hold significant quantities.

Decree No. 2016-288 of 10 March 2016

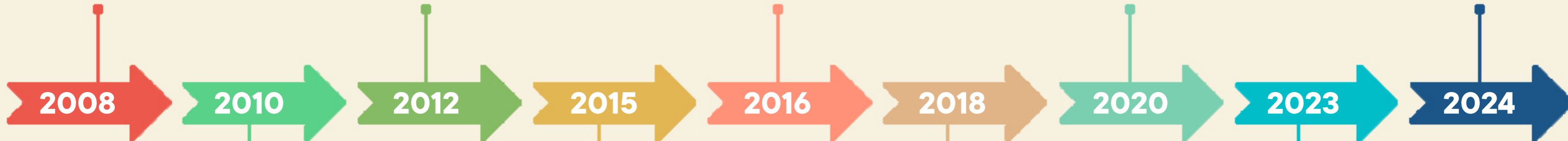
Obligation of sorting at source and recovery of bio-waste for producers of more than 10 tons and 60 liters of used oil per year.

Article L. 541-21-1 of February 10, 2020

Vote of the AGEC law for the fight against waste and circular economy.

Reinforcement of the AGEC Law on January 1, 2024

Obligation to sort biowaste at source for all, regardless of the volume produced and the activity of the producer/holder.

“Grenelle II” Law of 12 July 2010

Obligation of sorting at source and recovery of large producers of biowaste and used oil.

The Energy Transition Law of July 17, 2015

Reduce landfill waste by 50% by 2025 and gradually decouple economic growth and consumption of raw materials.

European Directorate of May 30, 2018

Obligation for the member states of the European Union to set up a separate management of biowaste before the end of 2023.

Reinforcement of the AGEC Law on January 1, 2023

The AGEC Act lowers the regulatory threshold for the obligation to recover bio waste to 5 tonnes per year.
